I also have attempted to locate the Terms of Service using MagicJack's "Frequently Asked Questions" ("FAQ") page, http://www.magicjack.com/1/fag/, including by searching for the terms (1) "Terms of Service," (2) EULA, and (3) "end-user license agreement. None of these searches of the FAQ returned any result that directed me to the MagicJack Terms of Service.

Attached hereto, collectively, as Exhibit 8 are printouts from the Merriam-Webster Online Dictionary webpages setting forth the definition of the word "spy", located at http://www.merriam-webster.com/dictionary/spy[1], the definition of the word "snoop", located at http://www.merriam-webster.com/dictionary/snoop[1], and the definition of the word "fake", located at http://www.merriam-webster.com/dictionary/fake[4].
